By submitting their work, authors grant CNS a non-exclusive license to use, reproduce, and distribute the content in any format, including print, online publication, promotional materials, and CNS publications.

Usage Rights

CNS may publish accepted abstracts and posters on the CNS website, in affiliated journals, or through other digital and print channels associated with CNS. Authors can reuse their work for other purposes if appropriate credit is given to CNS for the original presentation.

Author Responsibility

Authors are responsible for ensuring that their submitted content is accurate and does not infringe on the rights of third parties. It is the author's responsibility to obtain any necessary permissions for the inclusion of copyrighted material within their abstracts or posters.

Permission Requests

For third-party requests to reuse or republish content from CNS abstracts or posters, inquiries should be directed to the Child Neurology Society. Depending on the specific rights granted, CNS may refer them to the respective authors.

Publication and Dissemination

All accepted abstracts will be made available on the CNS website and may be included in associated CNS journals or other educational resources. This ensures the broad dissemination of valuable research in child neurology while respecting the rights of the authors.

Embargo Policy for Abstracts and Posters

All abstracts and posters are under embargo until the first day of the Child Neurology Society Annual Meeting. The embargo is lifted at the start of the meeting.
