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Pediatric-onset MS, MOGAD and other neuroinflammatory disorders of childhood are believed to represent the earliest manifestations of analogous pathophysiological processes underlying adult-onset forms of these same diseases. Due to the increase in comorbidities and environmental exposures that come with aging, focusing on novel disease-related targets in children can shed light on mechanisms driving the development, evolution, and persistence of neuroinflammation in humans across the lifespan.
