Caroline (Carrie) Black Buchanan, MD, is a board-certified developmental-behavioral pediatrician at Greenwood Genetic Center, a Rett syndrome Center of Excellence, in Greenville, South Carolina. She is also an assistant professor in the Department of Pediatrics, MUSC Children's Health, at Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. After graduating from the Medical College of Georgia in Augusta, Dr Buchanan joined the Greenville Health System, where she completed a pediatric residency and a developmental-behavioral pediatric fellowship.

Dr. Buchanan has authored or co-authored several articles on Rett syndrome and has been a principal investigator and sub-investigator for research related to Rett syndrome, including

studies of trofinetide for the treatment of girls and women with Rett syndrome. She is currently involved in the development of outcome measures, the identification of biomarkers, and the design and implementation of clinical trials.
